

### Maintenance Fee Heads-Up

As a reminder to all Tealwood Homeowners, invoices for the 2006 Homeowners Maintenance fees will be mailed out in mid-November. The fees for 2006 are \$485. This is an increase of 6.5% over the 2005 assessment. This fee is levied to pay for such services as our security contract for the Constable Patrol, the contract for the private backdoor garbage collection, maintenance of the common areas, including the Tealwood/Gessner islands, water for the landscaping, and electric services for our lights and sprinklers.

The fee increase is largely due to the increase in our Harris County
Constable security contract. As many of you know, this contract with the
Constable provides our neighborhood (as well as other participating neighborhood associations) with security patrols. This increased fee will allow us, based on forecasts, to have a balanced budget for 2006. Of course, at the February 2006 meeting, you all can review the budget.

## CRIME PREVENTION TIPS Memorial Village Police

Thefts from vehicles continue to be one of the major crimes committed in the Memorial Villages. The recommendations listed below can help prevent you from becoming a victim of this type of crime.

ALWAYS lock your vehicle and set the alarm system when your vehicle is unoccupied, even when your vehicle is parked at your residence or leaving it unattended for a short period of time.

NEVER leave keys, including house keys, in any unoccupied vehicle. If you attend an event using valet parking only leave the attendants your vehicle keys.

NEVER leave valuables visible in an unattended vehicle, lock them in a secure storage area or conceal them from sight.

There have been a lot of positives for our neighborhood this year and one negative that has concerned the board. Although we have constable patrol, we cannot completely eliminate crime in the neighborhood. Most of the crime has been minor and similar to the Villages. It has generally been theft from garages when garage doors have been left open and theft from vehicles when left unlocked at night. There was a 'ring' that was bypassing car alarms and stealing electronics in West Memorial including Tealwood. The ring members have been caught.

However, there have been four more sophisticated home burglaries when residents were out of town. The neighborhood will be alerted with a pink (what else) flyer. Knowing neighbors and looking out for each other to me is one of the best ways to keep crime away.

The annual coffee will be held on Tuesday November 22nd at the home of Ruth and Jim Harrison at 10 in the morning. The intent of the coffee is for new residents to meet their neighbors. Several board members and I are looking forward to this coffee.

An ongoing goal has been for continued beautification of the neighborhood. Board members Mike Connor and Alina Jezerinac have been working hard designing two island beds to bring color to the Gessner islands as well as staying on top of general maintenance. Little by little, we are looking at adding beds in the
